We will also need to box up items for storage, which will be put back in the new kitchen once it is complete.






Children's Corner

PAPER LIGHT UP ANGEL





HOW TO MAKE:

1. Print out the template from the following download link and cut it out. Template here - <u>Download</u>

Or at: https://www.bakerross.co.uk/craft-ideas/kids/paper-light-up-angel/

- 2. Cut out the parts of the face in coloured card and stick them together.
- 3. With the angel wrap it into a cone and slit the wings together.
- 4. Glitter the edges of the dress and the wings with glue and glitter and let dry.
- 5. Stick on the head and arms.
- 6. Place a battery tealight under the skirt to light her up.

Top Tip

If the wings feel loose, you can secure them together using a little tape or glue.
