BAPTISM

If you would like your child to be baptised you will need to firstly download and complete a baptism registration form (visit our website at www.immaculateconception.church, go to the 'Documents' tab and click on 'Forms' on the drop down list. Here you will find the baptism registration form. This should be returned to the parish office. You will then need to make contact with Deacon Gerard after one of the Sunday Masses to discuss further and make suitable arrangements.

OPEN DAY ST ANNES CATHOLIC SCHOOL & SIXTH FORM

St Anne's is an outstanding 11-18 state funded Catholic school for girls with a mixed sixth form in the heart of Southampton, with excellent transport links to all points of the compass. Places are open to all families seeking a school with a strong Catholic ethos. The school has been placed in the top 10% of all schools nationally in recent years for the exceptional level of progress achieved by students of all abilities, and strong academic achievement at GCSE and A Level consistently places St Anne's as one of the highest performing school in Hampshire.

ANOTHER SATURDAY NIGHT FOR OUR STREET PASTORS' TEAM

Our Team, two women and three men, had been out on the Southampton city centre streets for 3 hours and it had just turned 12.30am. It was a normal night, many people out celebrating at restaurants, theatre, cinema and clubs, and we had casually chatted with many. We also met about a dozen street people, sharing hot chocolate, water, pot noodles and biscuits, chatting about their circumstances and ways in which we might help and, if they wished, we shared a night prayer that they would know God's love and healing in their lives, with if appropriate, a prayer for some specific need.

We crossed the road by the Cenotaph, when a young man, in his twenties, approached us and asked,

"You guys are Christians, yes?"

We agreed and shared that we are from different Christian churches across the city but we have the common commitment to serving Jesus.

He then said, "I was brought up a Catholic but, in my teens, I drifted away. God did not seem relevant to me and I could not see that he exists. Things have happened to me and I am now re-evaluating my life."

"Sure," we replied. "Many people find that but God is always there, faithful, patient, forgiving, so you can always change."

"Maybe", he said. "I cannot say I am fully convinced yet but I have prayed and I want to join in a church again. I am also sorry for some horrible things I have done but I know I want to change and make a difference."

We chatted some more and gave information about churches before parting with hugs and friendly words of encouragement.

"Heavenly Father, be with that young man, guide and protect him by Your Spirit. Let him know Your Love in his life and may he grow in Your Ways."

Later that night, our team helped some other drunken young people get safely home, calmed another young woman distressed after a break-up and chatted with others about the 'ups and downs' in their lives.

What a blessing to be able to share God's love on our streets!!




