### My dear Friends:

A Blessed, Loving and Joy-filled Christmas to each one of you! May those symbolic flames of the Advent Candle be born in our hearts as *Hope, Faith, Joy and Peace.* As the Faith Community/Family, of the Immaculate Conception, may we be rooted in, grounded in, the green Advent Wreath, *Hesed, God's Gentle Mercy.* As family, friends and relatives gather round the Christmas table to celebrate Christ's birth, may He be truly born within our hearts and lives.

You know, once again, I was thinking of those poignant words of St. Teresa of Avila, on the ways in which Jesus needs us to give birth to him as the God-Bearer (Theotokos/ $\Theta$ εοτόχος), ... Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours... and yet... how easily it is to be 'derailed', and diverted, from this divine quest!

King Herod, and various leaders of his day, were derailed from their divine quests by ambition, fear and greed. It is so easy to become 'derailed' on one's life's journey - when we forget its purpose! On this, the celebration of Christ's birth, we are reminded that we are God's unique creations called to be His Bearers of Love, Peace, Justice Compassion and Healing in our world.

One of the great mystics once said: Wear gratitude like a cloak and it will feed every corner of your life... it is the path of tender heroes, of the heroes of tenderness who, whatever happens, keep the flame of adoration burning on the altar of their hearts. That flame of 'adoration' is the loving unfolding, and fusion, of our souls with God. It is our life's journey, in Gibran's words, of making the human heart a temple, the soul and altar, and the mind a priest!

I think, essentially, this means having a spirit of gratitude for the *gift of being alive/life* and the blessings with God has graced us. And so, my dear friends, perhaps, on this special day, we can look around us, rejoice in the gifts of Love, Joy, Family and friendship and, in a *spirit of gratitude* ask God to help us give birth to that same, divine gratitude in our own daily lives. It is then that, in the words of Howard Thurman:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.
