

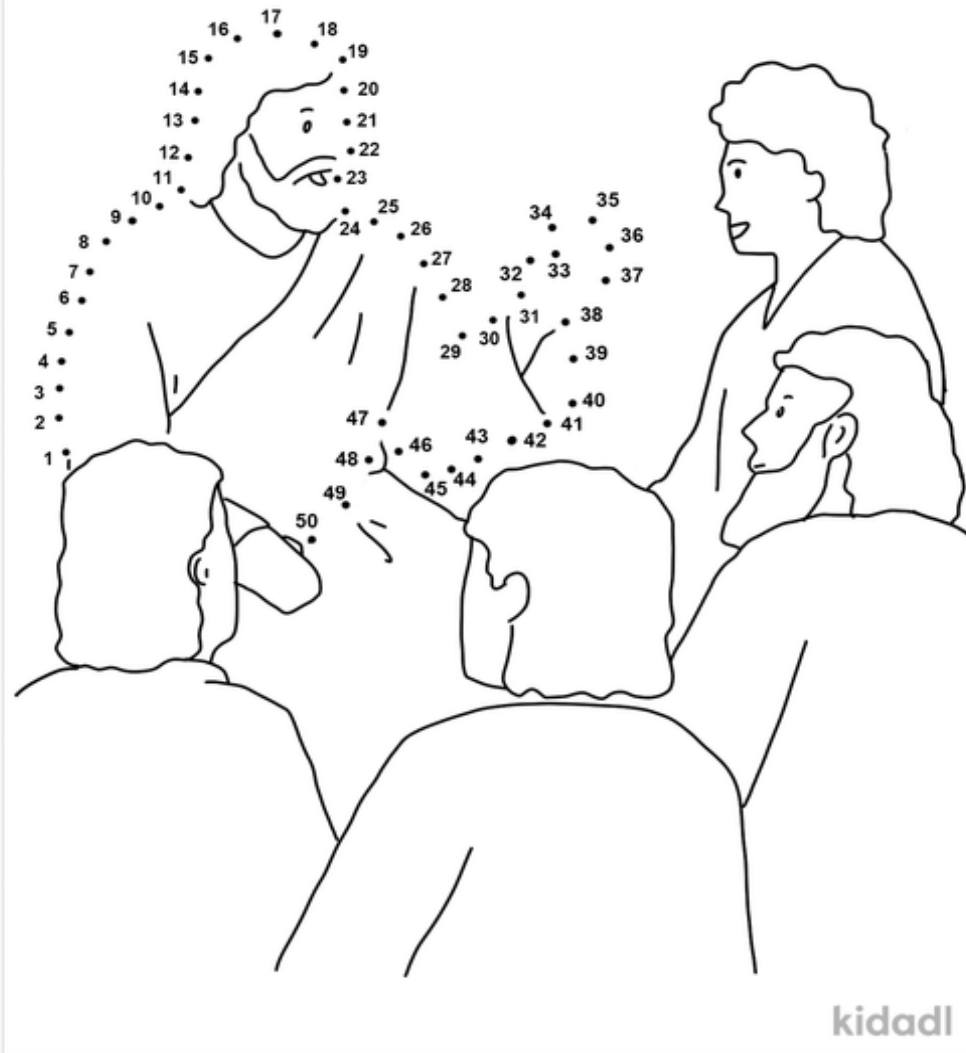

The disciples went out telling everyone they met to repent of their sins and turn to God. They also cast out many evil spirits and they healed many sick people. 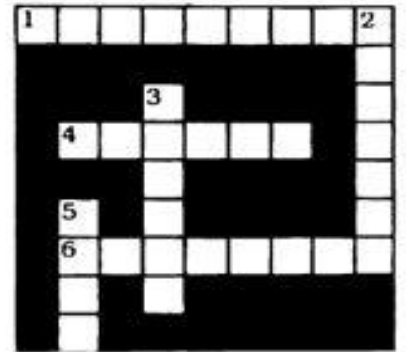

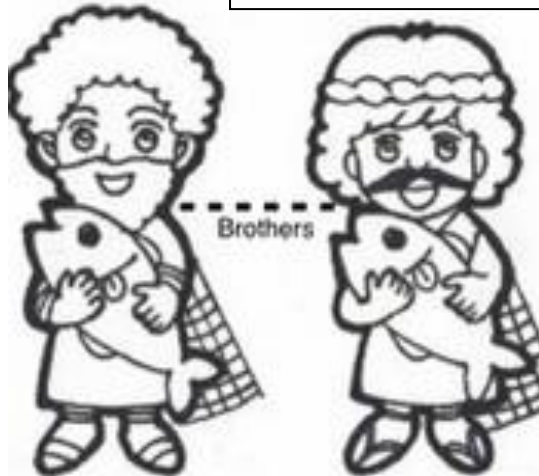

# Meet the 12 Disciples



Andrew heard about Jesus first and then went to get his brother, Simon. They were fishermen. Simon was given the name "Peter" by Jesus.

Peter means rock and Jesus told Peter he was the rock on which the church would be built.



The brothers, James and John worked together in their father's fishing business before following Jesus. They were known as the "sons of thunder" because of their tempers.



James the son of Alphaeus. sometimes called "James the Less" because he was younger than the other James

Thaddeus was also known as Judas and he is sometimes referred to as Judas not Iscariot because he was not the one that betrayed Jesus.



Simon the Zealot. A Zealot was a member of a Jewish revolutionary group that was trying to overthrow the Roman government and free the Jews.



Bartholomew's other name was "Nathanael" and Philip were not brothers but seemed to almost always be together.



Matthew was also known as Levi. He was a tax collector for the Romans when Jesus called him as an apostle.



Judas Iscariot was the one who betrayed Jesus.



Thomas, known as doubting Thomas because after Jesus rose from the dead he refused to believe until he put his hand into the holes in Jesus' hands where the nails had been.
