

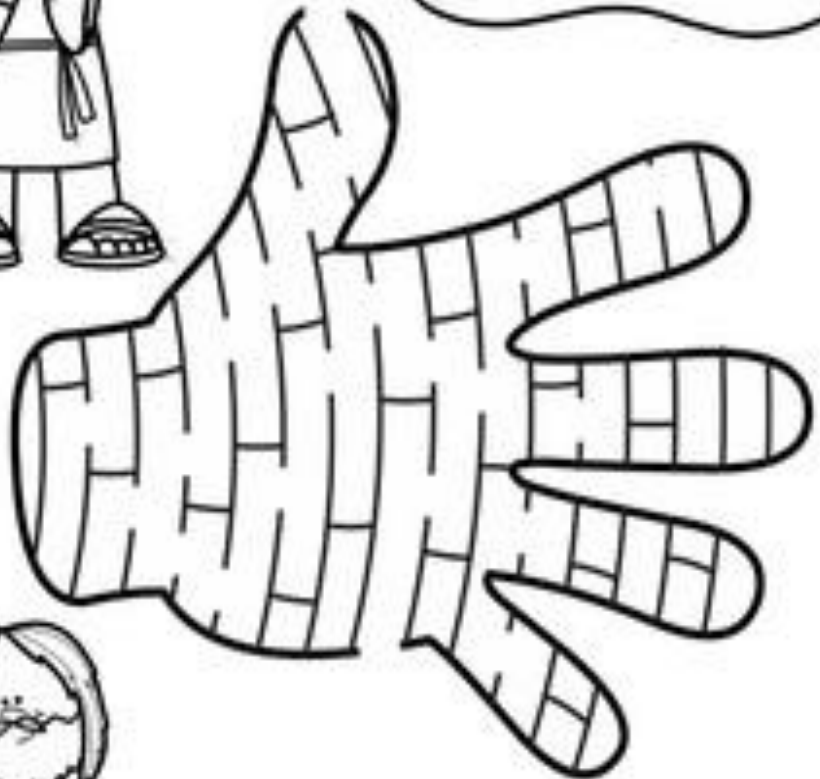

He had heard about how Jesus had been healing many people so when he saw Jesus, he ran to meet him right away. He fell at the feet of Jesus. "My daughter is sick and is about to die," he said. "Please come and place your hands on her; heal her so she can live." Jesus immediately began walking with Jairus toward his house so that he could heal the girl. As they walked through the streets of town, some men came up to Jairus and said to him, "Your daughter is dead, there is no need to bother Jesus now." Jairus was heartbroken but Jesus paid no attention to what the people said. He turned to Jairus and said, "**Don't be afraid, only believe.**"

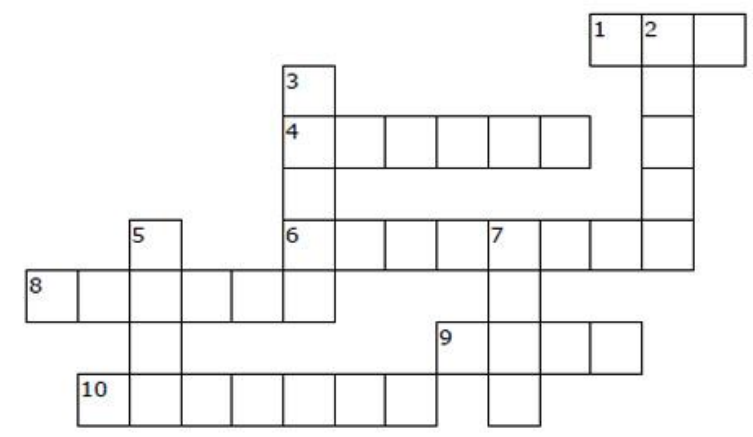

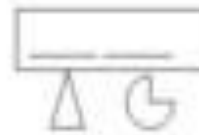
